## CITY TO BE CALLED UPON TO JOIN GLOBAL FIGHT FOR DEMOCRACY

PORT ELIZABETH will this month be called upon to join the global fight for Democracy. Because Moral Re-Armament emissaries have sized up the City as a go-ahead industrial centre, enjoying smooth teamwork, their international three-act play, "The Forgotten Factor," to be presented from July 17 to 21, will be expected to fulfil its deeper purpose.

"We realise that labourmanagement relationships here are among the best in the country," a spokesman for the Movement stated yesterday. "The play in which I have a part is essentially an industrial drama, calculated to oil the wheels of industry wherever it is shown. That object has been achieved in many different parts of 13 countries.

"But here, where industry has grown without undue internal strife, we anticipate that the play's more subtle message, which is one of the great messages of Moral Re-Armament, will strike home among thinking citizens.

"We want industry here to play a bigger part in handling problems, local, national and international. We want industry to work still harder for Democracy and to help in conquering rival ideologies by presenting to the world a smooth-running, spirited Democracy.

"Politics can jeopardise industry but industry is the real battleground of Democracy and healthy industry can achieve the ideals for which we fight."
