**RE-ARMAMENT
TEAM IN CITY**

The Moral Re-Armament team of 17 which came to South Africa three months ago from Caux, Switzerland, held a meeting in the Duncan Hall, Johannesburg, last night, where they met and addressed members of the South African Mineworkers' Union.

The meeting was well attended, many prominent Johannesburg businessmen and industrialists being present.

Welcoming the team, Mr. D. G. Malherbe, the Government Mining Engineer, said that people should not always meet at round-table conferences but should have opportunities of meeting informally as they were doing that night.

"Any organisation," Mr. Malherbe said, "which tends to bring opposing factors together, is an organisation which should be encouraged."

Mr. Bremer Hofmeyer, a South African Rhodes Scholar, who was personal assistant to Dr. Frank Buchman for four years, and who brought the team to South Africa, led the proceedings and introduced the speakers.

Songs expressing the spirit of Moral Re-Armament were sung by a quintette consisting of Paul Hogue (U.S.A.), Miss Sheila Gillibrand (England), Miss Dorothy Page (Ireland), Andrew Hastings (Scotland) and Miss Hildi Zeller (Switzerland).
