Drama Aids Moral Rearmament

CAUX (Switzerland).— The European Assembly for Moral Rearmament featured a Sunday session this week, by presenting plays and films which the assembly leaders intend to disseminate as weapons in the war of ideas.

Among the plays which met with an enthusiastic reception was "The Good Road," which has a cast of 170 persons, composed largely of youths of 20 nations, who recently returned to Europe from America.

Another drama to be presented in the war of ideas is "Forgotten Factory," an industrial play which the miners' delegates from Britain and the chiefs of unions from northern France reported had brought a new spirit into the pits and industry in general.

2,300 DELEGATES

So far, 2,300 delegates from 31 nations have attended the assembly since it opened on July 17. Hundreds more are expected before the adjournment at the end of September. Delegates from Italy are expected to arrive in force early in September.

German reporters said thousands of letters had come in from Germans all over the occupational zones as a result of their articles and broadcasts explaining the work going on here.

The Japanese delegates held a special conference with the Chinese, and expressed regret at the sufferings Japan had caused China. They and the Chinese pledged themselves to fight together to create a new moral code in the Far East.—(Sapa-U.P.)
