

IN PRETORIA FOR FOUR WEEKS

A travelling team of the Moral Re-armament Movement who are touring the Union at the invitation of the South African delegates who attended the World Assembly in Switzerland, are now in Pretoria and will remain here for the coming four weeks.

Mr. Bremer Hofmeyr, a former South African Rhodes Scholar and leader of the team, brought with him an international group of 16 men and women from Britain, United States of America, Kenya, Switzerland and Ireland.

Among those travelling with this group are Mrs. Bremer Hofmeyr; Mr. Andrew Strang, a businessman from Scotland; the Rev. Paul from Pennsylvania; Mr. Rev. Paul Hogue from Pennsylvania; Mr. and Mrs. J. N. Hopcraft, farmers from Kenya; Group Captain P. S. Foss; Mr. Charles Burns, and a quartette of singers drawn from the internationally-known Makinac Chorus.

"Our main objective," said Mr. Hofmeyr, "is to give democracy a Christian ideology — an answer to the materialist ideologies that are trying to conquer the world. We want people who will give as much to build a Christian world, as the materialists are sacrificing to build a materialistic world."

While in Pretoria the team will make its headquarters at the home of Mrs. D. Macmillan, and they intend to hold conferences with leaders in various walks of life, as well as meeting in private homes and in public.
