

Oxford Group Plea Helpful To Women

Amazing Response Illustrated by Large Numbers Attending Meetings.

The amazing response which has been given by the women of Ottawa to the message of the Oxford Group can be realized only by one attending the meetings. This morning meetings held for women and young women were attended by well over 500 people. Approximately 300 ladies gathered in the ball room to hear the message for the first time. Miss Eleanor Napier Forde of Montreal led this group, and others who told the stories of their lives, who told of having surrendered their lives to God at a time of some great need and of the peace and the purpose which has come into their lives since that time, were Frau Anneliese Von Cramon of Silesia, Germany; Miss Marie Clarkson of St. Hugh's College, Oxford; Miss Ella Lee and Miss Jean Morton, of Edinburgh, Scotland, and Mrs. Ebenezer MacMillan of Pretoria, South Africa.

Mrs. H. Kenaston Twitchell, of Oxford, led the discussion in the meeting held for girls which was attended by about 50 young ladies who have become deeply interested in the movement and who are anxious to learn all about it. A large number of those present at this meeting took part in the discussion and several announced that they have made the decision to give their lives to God and to endeavor to follow His plan for them. Miss Jean Hood of Edinburgh, Scotland; Miss Winifred Carr and Miss Ruth Bennett, of London, England, and Baroness Lillian Van Heeckeren Van Kell of de Steeg, Holland, were the other members of the group who spoke at this gathering.

Seven more Ottawa women announced that they have made the decision to give their lives to God's guidance at the advanced meeting for women which was held in the salon under the leadership of Miss Olive M. Jones of New York, and which was attended by over 200 women.

Meetings for business women and girls will be held this evening at five o'clock and a general meeting for women and men at eight.
