BIG CROWD FOR MRA MEETING

HUNDREDS of people of all races are expected to attend tonight's Moral Re-Armament meeting in the Harry Margolis Hall, Salisbury.

The Prime Minister's son, Mr Alec Smith, a stalwart of the movement in Rhodesia; Sir Cyril Hatty, a former Minister of the Treasury for Southern Rhodesia during Federal days; and Professor Hudson Ntsanwisi, Chief Minister of the Gazankulu homeland in the Transvaal, are to speak at the meeting.

The theme is: Southern Africa—what kind of change? The speakers will talk on different aspects of this.

Other speakers will include: Mr Conrad Hunte, former vice-captain of the West Indies cricket team; and the Rev. Andrew Ndhlela, General Superintendent of the Methodist Church (British) in Rhodesia.

The MRA force of 25 people from 14 countries who are in Rhodesia to perform their musical presentation, *Time to Choose*, will take part.

The group next week begins a tour of other centres including Bulawayo, Gwelo and Selukwe and on May 27 a four-day conference is to begin at the University of Rhodesia.

The Mayor of Salisbury, Councillor Roy Wright, is to open tonight's meeting.
