THE Moral Re-Armament movement can liquidate the evils of corruption and hypocrisy which had assumed alarming proportions in India, said Mr. Rajmohan Gandhi, MRA leader, in Bombay on Sunday.

Mr. Gandhi was addressing a mass rally at Chowpatty.

The country was beset with crises on most fronts, due mainly to the activities of "power-hungry" politicians and "sham socialists," he said. Its future lay with the masses who should not countenance any attempt to divide them.

Mr. Gandhi said it was heartening to find the youth of the country taking to the ideals of MRA.

About 200 students, drawn mostly from the city's schools, rendered songs in Marathi, Hindi and Gujarati, under the direction of Mr. Herbert Allen, xylophonist and co-composer of the music in "Space is so startling", the MRA play which has become famous the world over.
