## **Rhodesians 'could be pioneers of new society'**

RHODESIA could pioneer the creation of a new society and show the world how to solve its problems without using violence, members of the Moral Rearmament Movement said yesterday in Bulawayo.

"The recent assembly in Salisbury demonstrated what the new society could be, because all races lived together as a united group," said Mr. James Trehane, of Britain.

He felt that the assembly had been a success because of the great interest shown in it.

"We came here to show how Moral Rearmament was used to solve problems in our own countries," said Senator Ralph Vibert, of Jersey, in the Channel Islands.
