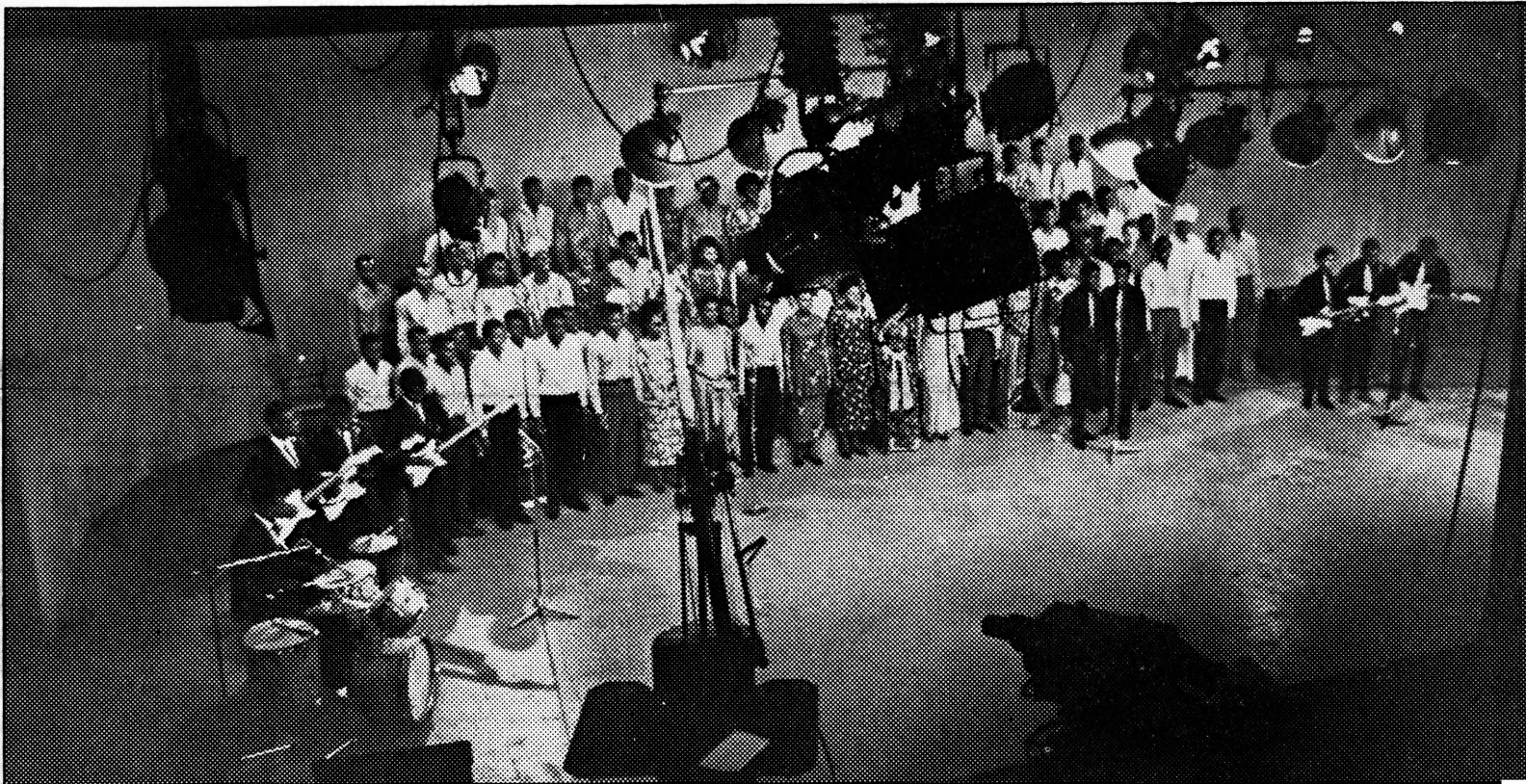


Harambee Africa

(below) The cast entertain H.E. Mzee Jomo Kenyatta, the President of Kenya, and members of his family at his country home.



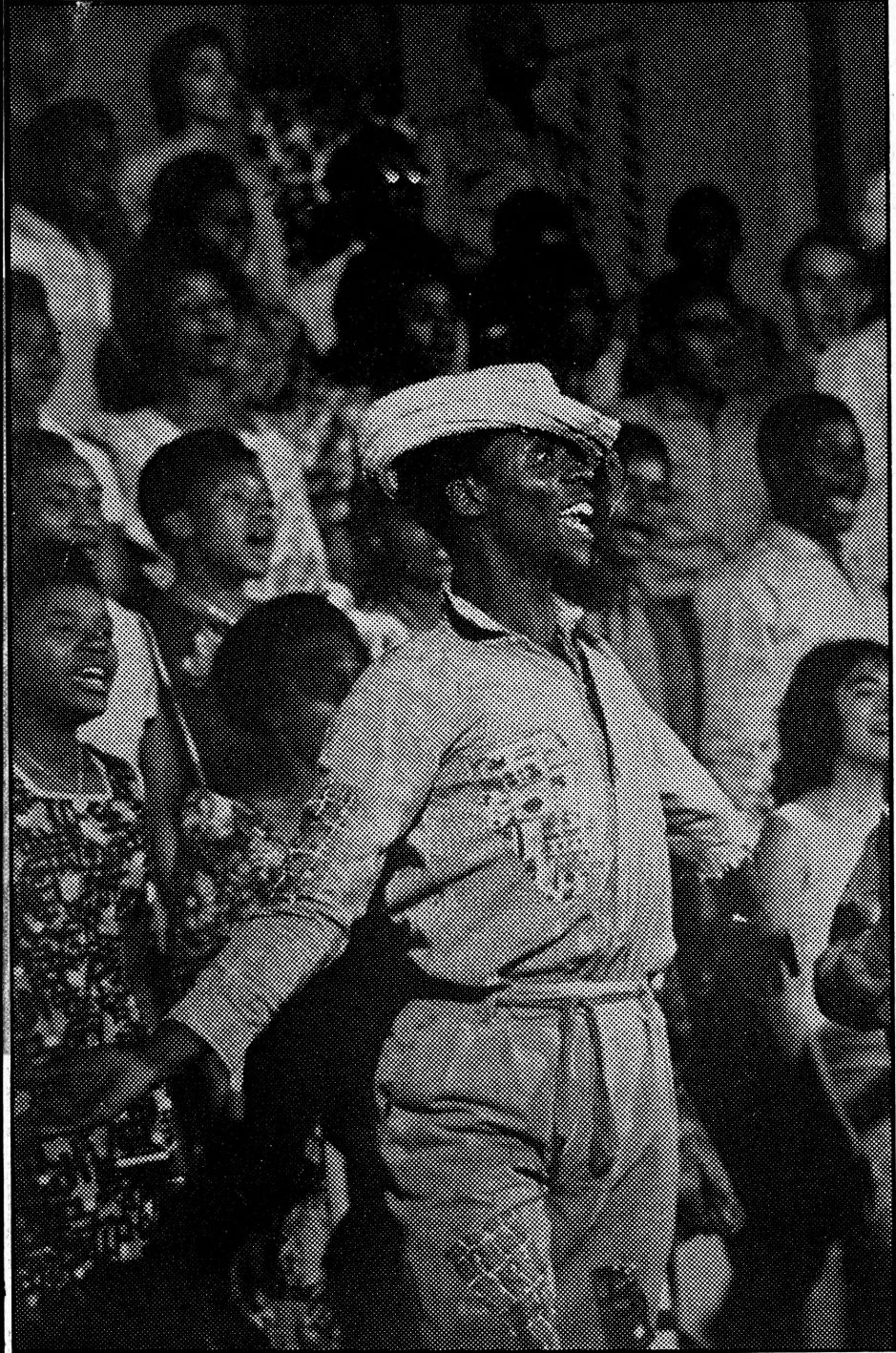
'TAKE HARAMBEE TO ALL NATIONS'

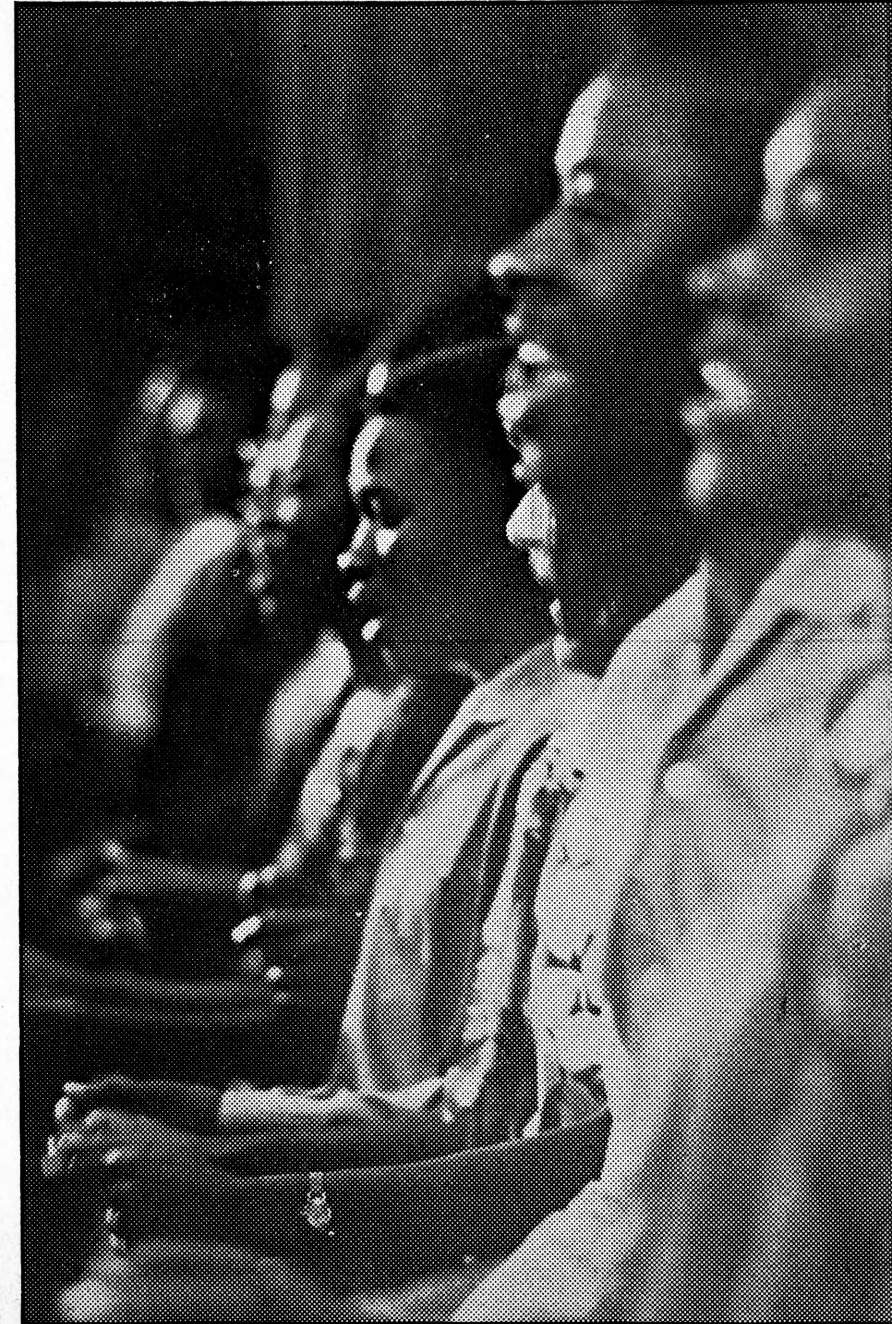
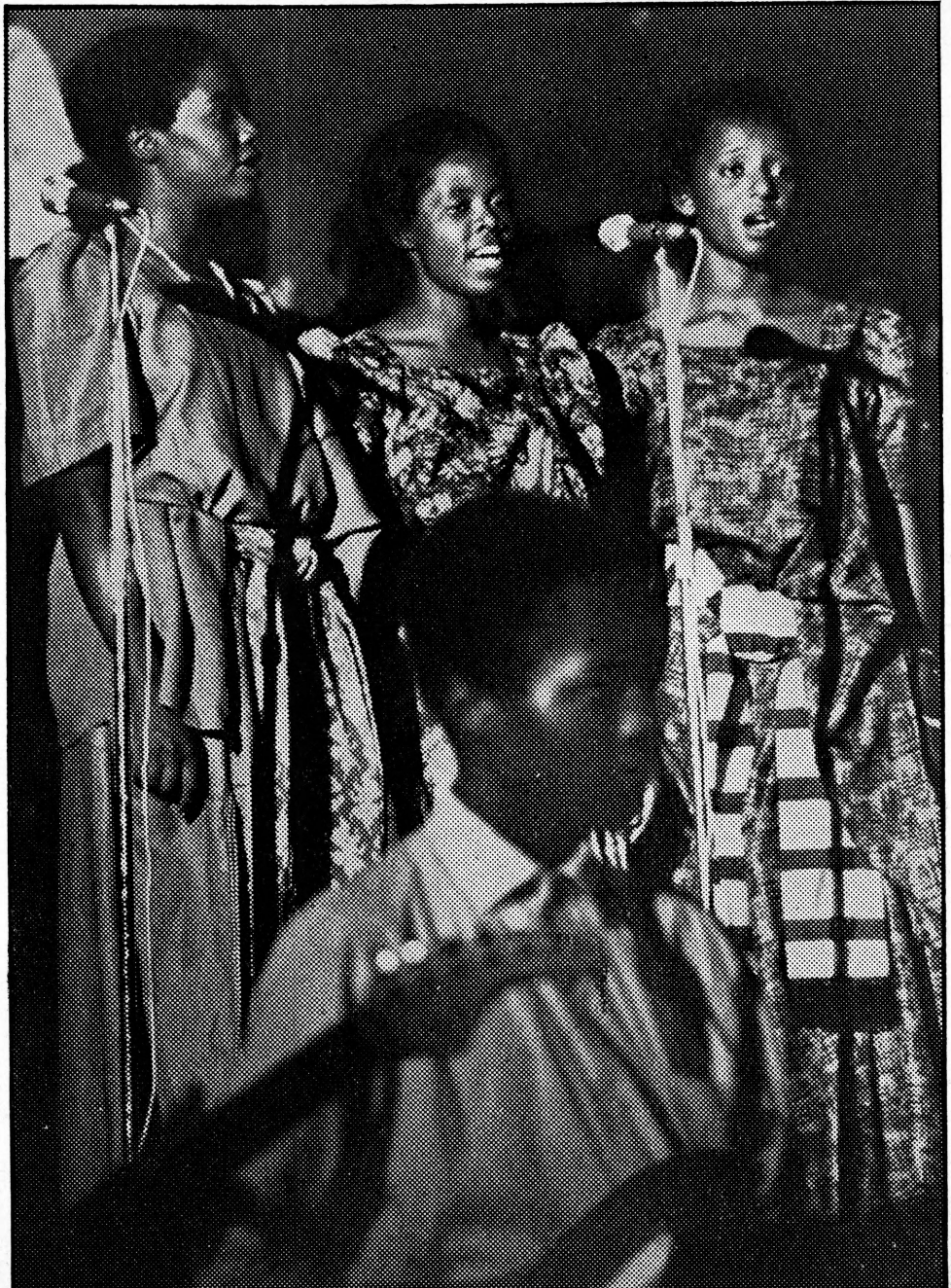
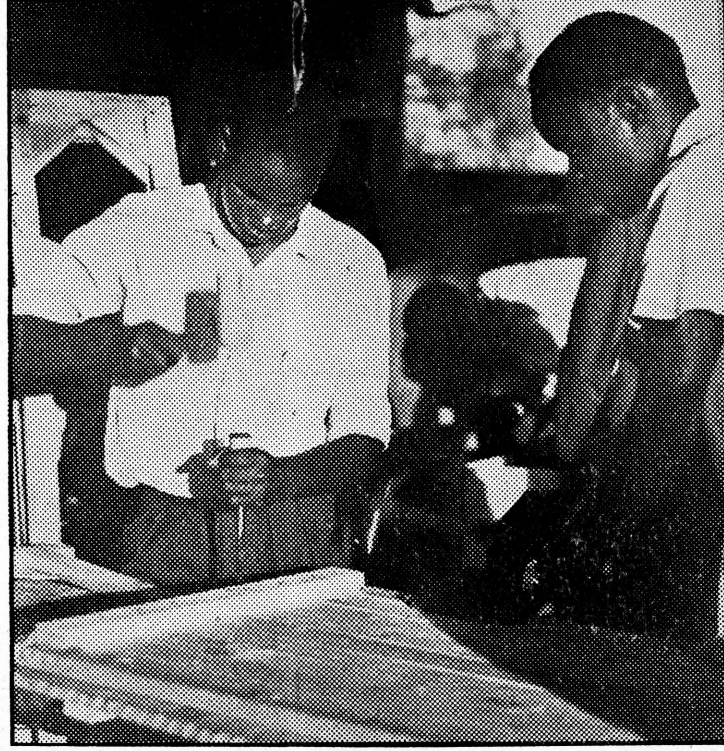
(top centre) Building their own scenery while the show was in rehearsal. The stage crew came from Moshi Technical College, Tanzania.

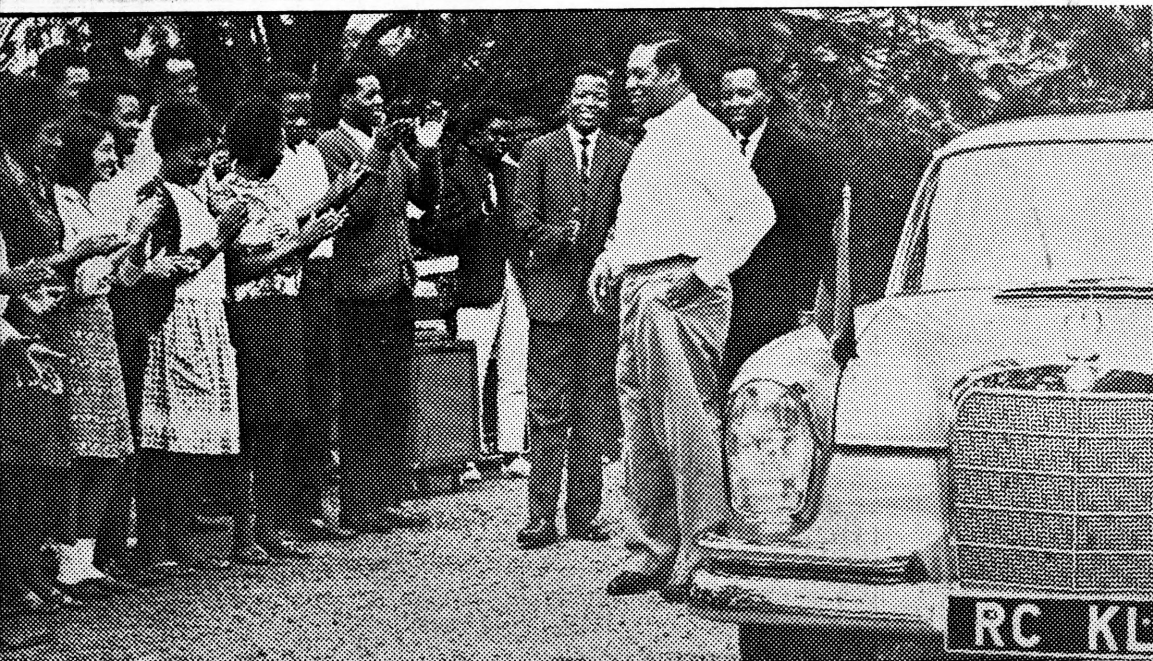
