MRA VISIT TO SA

Twenty-five members of Moral Rearmament from 13 countries recently arrived at Jan Smuts Airport for a two-month visit to South Africa, reports *Die Transvaler*.

Among them are musicians and students. South Africa has Moral Rearmament members of all races, and the visitors — from the US, France, Japan and Malta — are in South Africa to study the situation for themselves.

Mr Robert Corcoran, a British musician, said: "We want to tell everybody of our experiences and our own countries' problems. We want to teach them that real security and satisfaction comes from obedience to God".

The visitors who paid their own fares hope to forge stronger bonds between South Africa and their own countries by seeing for themselves and conveying the true image of South Africa abroad. They will visit Atteridgeville, a Black residential area near Pretoria, and meet homeland leaders and parliamentarians. Prof. H. Ntsanwisi, Chief Minister of Gazankulu, the Rev. Sam Buti and Professor Dawid Bosch, of Pretoria, will lecture the visitors.
