THE number of people who called to comment on last week's column about the efficacy of prayer is some-

Wilna Maritz of the Western
Cape called to say she knew the
identity of the man who drove us from Modder B Prison after the mass detention of political and business leaders in 1977.

She said he was Jan Bosman, a name which immediately rang a bell.

Bosman, a former member of the old Administration Board, drove me, Dr Nthato Motlana and Leonard Mosala from Modder B Prison on our release 20 years ago.

I got another call from a black Eastern Cape gentleman, who said he thought the story was great but incomplete. For instance, he said, I should have revealed what Bosman said in his prayer on that lonely road five kilometres from Modder B.

For those who missed the piece, I was reminded of this remarkable event by a picture given to me by Motlana, showing myself, him and Mosala. The picture was taken soon after we were released in 1978.

## interesting things

I spoke to Bosman last week. He said even more interesting things. He did not know why he was picked by the National Party to fetch us.

The directive came from minister Connie Mulder. He said he was as agitated as we were

He said I looked frightened when he saw us in the major's office at the prison. He brought us some sandwiches and, when we were about five kilometres out of the prison, he asked us if he could pray.

He prayed for the impossible in those sad days - that we should work together, black and white: that there should be reconciliation and forgiveness. It took 20 years for the prayer

to be answered.

Incidentally, we are once more entering that hair-raising pre-election period, when men of stupid, radical and violent persuasions decide they should make their point, violently.

I can never forget the dangerous, heart-stopping planned before the 1994 elections.

How can we forget the faceless monsters who entered trains and sprayed innocent people with bullets? How can we forget the deliberate lighting of highly inflammable stuff in KwaZulu-Natal?

Some of the events of that incredible time are tentatively being told. The spectacular killing of three khaki-clad members of the Afrikaner (AWB) Weerstandsbeweging

Mmabatho is one such story.

I understand this was a conspiracy from high places for the slege of Mafikeng, more bloody than anything this country had ever seen. Arrangements had been ruide to store weapons at Mmabatho airport.

All the black soldiers in Lucas Mangope's army were deliberately disarmed before the event. Groups of AWB members and other Afrikaner men from surrounding areas were to drive to the airport, where they would be given the stored ar ns.

A war was planned, starting from

Mmabatho to the rest of the country. Senior Bophuthatswana politicians and black military people were part of this planned violent takeo /er.

## Heard of coup

Unfortunately for them, at d most happily for us, some black soldiers heard of the coup. They aribushed and hit one of the whites suarding the arms at Mmabatho with a brick, disarmed him and got hole of the stored weapons at the airport

These were distributed to black soldiers. Instead of the khaki-clad rebels finding friends and arms in Mmabatho, they met very angry, heavily armed black soldiers

They panicked and started the indiscriminate shooting of people in the streets of Mmabatho as their convoy drove out. One group did not make it. The rest is history.

I am not saying this is the unvarnished truth of what took place. I can obviously not check nor youch for its veracity. Time will tell.

There must be some people with very bad consciences who will take courage and reveal all one day.

In the meantime the kil ers and thieves who are attempting to repeat what happened then must be flushed out, and if we were not such a darned humane country, strung up from the nearest tree for the traitors they are.
